World War II Memoriam




First Lieutenant, #O-666121, United States Army Air Corps Charles William "Bill" Bauman was born on October 31, 1917, the son of Mr. C.Z Bauman and the husband of Margaret S. Bauman, 633 Stewart Drive, Dallas, Texas.

Lt. Bauman was the Command pilot of a B-24H, #42-52366, named "The Spirit of Hollywood," in the 766th Bomb Squadron, 461st Bomb Group. On April 13, 1944 Lt. Bauman, was in the deputy lead position, attacking the target of the Duna Tokol Aircraft Components Factory, Budapest, Hungary. His aircraft was hit in the wing by flak and 1/3rd of his wing broke off causing the aircraft to spin out of control crashing into another B-24 in the formation.

The Missing Air Crew Report is #3973. Lieutenant Bauman and his entire crew were buried at Jefferson Barracks National Cemetery, St. Louis, Missouri in Section #82, Site #30B.

The \$500,000 Sunset High School opened in September 1925, adding a center of teaching and learning in rapidly growing southwest Oak Cliff. On Monday, March 3, 2014, a weather cancellation left the campus on Jefferson Boulevard empty. But at City Hall, an effort to honor and preserve the school gained some headway.

The city Landmark Commission unanimously backed a request to designate Sunset a city historical landmark.

The matter now goes to the Dallas school board for approval and then on to the City Plan Commission and City Council for a final decision.

Word is, the DISD is favorable to the idea unlike its failed opposition to landmark status for Adamson High School. Word also is, the district doesn't want the landmark designation protecting Sunset's western facade from future expansion.

If approved Sunset would be the last of the city's eight oldest high schools to gain landmark status.

Preservation architect Marcel Quimby compiled and wrote the nomination document with an assist from Alumni Association Board members.

"This is the most thorough designation report I've ever seen," Katherine Seale, the landmark commission chairwoman, said. "DISD should be very proud to have all this information."


